Steel City Invitational Returns



The prestigious "Steel City Invitational" high school basketball tournament returns to the Pete Hanna Center at Samford University on Tuesday December 20th. The 3 day event is in its 4th year and is hosted by Mountain Brook High School and Knight Eady Sports Group. The tournament sponsor is MedCenter Mazda.

This year's tournament features 4 #1 ranked teams in their classification and some of the

state's best players as well. With 12 boys teams and an elite girls showcase, every matchup will be exciting.

Having been around the tournament and seeing many of the teams and players firsthand on multiple accounts, I decided to breakdown the schedule and preview players and the tournament as a whole.

SCHEDULE:

Tuesday December 20:

9:00 A.M. Parker vs Paul Bryant

Parker began this season 4-0, including a 70-69 win over Huffman. As a 5A team that was a big win over a strong 7A team. But how will they fare against the Paul

Bryant Stampede? Bryant enters with a signature win over Gadsden City in their season opener. With it being the 1st game, look to see which team starts out strongly. Parker can be dangerous if they get some momentum. The winner will play Huffman on Tuesday at 3:00 P.M in the 2nd round.

10:30 A.M. Ramsay vs Sacred Heart

A highly anticipated matchup between back to back 1A state champion, Sacred Heart, and the Ramsay Rams. Don't let the Rams 6-7 record fool you, all losses are by an average of 3.5 points (2 games were in OT). This season, they have proved already that a 15+ second half point deficit is easy to overcome. For the Cardinals, be on the lookout for



Kevion Nolan. The Samford signee will be playing on his future home court and has lots of experience in this tournament. The battle tested Ramsay Rams feature *Kobe McClain, Justin Wiley, Brandon Houston* and more. The winner will play Auburn High School on Tuesday at 4:30 P.M. in the 2nd round.

12:00 P.M. Vestavia vs Lanett

Vestavia enters this year's field under new head coach, Patrick Davis. To date, the Rebels have not played on a neutral court. However 2A #4 Lanett is traveling over 2 hours. Will that be a problem for the defending 2A State Champion? Lanett caught everyone's attention last year when they won head coach *Richard Carter* his 1st state championship as a head coach along with the 1st state championship in program



history. The Panthers celebrated with on court backflips. Will the Lanett Panthers be flipping to the second round or will the home town Vestavia Hills rebels prevail? The winner will play Mountain Brook on Tuesday at 6:00 P.M. in the 2nd round.

1:30 P.M. Pelham vs Hale County

Herb Jones and Alex Reese. These 2 players make up a big portion of Coach Avery Johnson's top 5 2017 recruiting

class. This is surely a matchup you don't want to miss. Reese was recently named Birmingham Tipoff Club Player of the Week for December 12th 2016. The winner will play Homewood on Tuesday night at 7:30 P.M. in the 2nd round.



3:00 P.M. Parker/Paul Bryant vs Huffman

Whoever wins between Parker and Paul Bryant will need to quickly recover and be ready to bring it because Huffman (7A #6) will be ready. 4:30 P.M. Ramsay/Sacred Heart vs Auburn



Mississippi State signee and high-flying forward, *Garrison Brooks*, is ready to prove he and Auburn have what it takes to win the tournament.
